Provision of sandbags

As The Borough Council's contractor may not be able to reach all properties before flooding occurs, it is strongly advised that residents living in flood risk areas obtain sandbags from a builders' merchant in advance, to enable early preparation and protection of their homes.

Across the village

Datchet's Community Emergency Management Team (CEMT) will coordinate support for the village and run the Community Support Centre via Datchet Parish Council Office and the Village Hall, Allen Way, by the recreation ground.

Should this area become flooded all central support will be relocated to Datchet Baptist Church Hall, 62 London Road, SI 3 9IR.

At your property

- Ensure it is safe to return to your property from emergency services
- BEWARE of hidden dangers when re-entering your property including structural damage, electric and gas issues, and contamination from sewage overflow
- Make records and photograph damage
- Contact your buildings and contents insurance companies
- Contact Thames Water Customer Services regarding sewage flooding on 0800 316 9800
- Ask the Royal Borough of Windsor & Maidenhead Council for assistance if you are struggling

HOW TO PREPARE

Know what's going on

View river levels near you, the 5 day flood risk and preparation advice via https://flood-warning-information.service.gov.uk

Register to get flood updates

Register with the Environment Agency's Floodline Warnings Direct service by calling 0345 988 1188 or visit www.gov.uk/sign-up-for-flood-warnings

Check the flooding history of your property

Email enquiries@environment-agency.gov.uk to receive a flooding report based on their records. This is free if it takes less than 18 hours to put together. If it takes longer, the Environment Agency may decide not to do it or will give you the option to pay for it.

Create your own flood plan

Download an easy template from www.gov.uk/government/publications/personal-flood-plan This will help you be more prepared for action. Don't leave it too late to act.

- Keep key contact details at your fingertips, including those of family members and utilities
- Make sure you know how to turn off your gas and electricity supply
- Prepare a check list of everything you need to protect - your pets, furniture, jewellery, car, etc.
- Install building protection like doorguards and closable air bricks in advance
- Devise an evacuation plan

Pack an emergency flood kit


Your kit should contain important personal documents including your insurance details, torch, battery or windup radio, warm and waterproof clothing, Wellington boots, blankets, rubber gloves, first aid kit and any prescription medicine. Bottled water and non-perishable foods may also prove useful.

If the water level reaches the black band on the Datchet Flood Pole situated on the river front, the Community Flood Plan will be activated. We have created this to:

- identify flood risk areas and coordinate volunteer helpers
- run a Community Support Centre at Datchet Village Hall
- request help from, take direction from and provide information to RBWM's Emergency Operation Centre
- provide local information to emergency responders
- liaise with neighbouring parishes

WHAT TO DO

Don't take risks

Flood water is dangerous!

Six inches of fast-flowing water can knock over an adult and two feet of water can move a car. Avoid walking or driving through flood water.

Stav safe

Focus on the safety of you and your family. Check in with everybody in your household. If they are not at home make sure they are safe somewhere. Move your family and pets upstairs, or to a high place with means of escape. Stay safe and listen to the advice of the emergency services. Evacuate if told to do so. Check in with vulnerable neighbours and relatives if you can but always avoid placing yourself at risk.

Get your property & belongings ready

Put flood protection equipment in place. Gather essential items together either upstairs or in a high place. Fill jugs and saucepans with clean water. Put plugs in sinks and baths and weigh down with a heavy object. Place sandbags to block off ground floor toilets.

Disconnect utilities

Turn off gas, electricity and water supplies when flood water is about to enter your home and if safe to do so. DO NOT touch sources of electricity when standing in flood water. Disconnect any equipment that uses water, like washing machines and dishwashers.

Evacuation procedure

If you are evacuated you are likely to be taken to the Community Support Centre at Datchet Village Hall. If required, temporary accommodation will be provided at Datchet's Rest Centre in 'CA Technologies' (formerly 'Computer Associates'), located in Ditton Park, Riding Court Road, Datchet SL3 9LL.
