DATCHET POST OFFICE

Just before Christmas, the Outreach PO received delivery of Covid-compliant Perspex screens and intended to reopen. These had become necessary due to the number of people visiting the PO without PPE masks. The Outreach was due to open on Tuesday 15 and 22 December. Unfortunately, on the 15th, the computer equipment failed and the Outreach had to close without conducting any business. Then on the 22nd, a combination of Tier 4 restrictions and delays in replacing the computer equipment meant that the Outreach was unable to open.

Action: The next proposed opening is 12 January 2021 which I will confirm as soon as I am able.

Sunday 4 July 2021
